

What does a life that pleases God look like? Should we desire to be the apple of his eye? Yes!



Psalm 17 is full of little treasures and familiar phrases. But at its core it is a song of contrast... the righteous path of eternal life vs. the destructive path of a wasted life. David's little song is a prayer for help to stay on the righteous path and resist the distraction of temporary pursuits.

¹Hear a just cause, O Lord; attend to my cry! Give ear to my prayer from lips free of deceit! ² From your presence let my vindication come! Let your eyes behold the right! ³ You have tried my heart, you have visited me by night, you have tested me, and you will find nothing; I have purposed that my mouth will not transgress.

With regard to the works of man, by the word of your lips I have avoided the ways of the violent.
My steps have held fast to your paths; my feet have not slipped.

⁶I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God; incline your ear to me; hear my words.

Wondrously show your steadfast love,
O Savior of those who seek refuge from their adversaries
at your right hand.
8 Keep me as the apple of your eye;

1. David declares his intention to live a life that invites God's blessings...

(to live in such a way where blessings will naturally flow into David's life) vv. 1-8a

A life that invites God's blessing:

- ⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.
 - ⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.
- ⁷ "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.
- ⁸ "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.
 - ⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

(Mathew 5:5-9, ESV)

A. God will thoroughly test the underpinnings of your life... why? He loves you!

B. God loves us enough to give us what we need, not everything we want, so that he can turn our affections to Him and away from temporary things.

...hide me in the shadow of your wings, ⁹ from the wicked who do me violence, my deadly enemies who surround me. ¹⁰ They close their hearts to pity; with their mouths they speak arrogantly. ¹¹ They have now surrounded our steps; they set their eyes to cast us to the ground.

- ¹² He is like a lion eager to tear, as a young lion lurking in ambush.
 - Arise, O Lord! Confront him, subdue him! Deliver my soul from the wicked by your sword,
- ¹⁴ from men by your hand, O Lord, from men of the world whose portion is in this life. You fill their womb with treasure; they are satisfied with children, and they leave their abundance to their infants.

2. To live a life that invites God's blessing I will have to fight everyday to resist a life that invites God's opposition. vv. 9-14

God opposes a proud life

God opposes a selfish life

God opposes a wasted life

¹⁵ As for me, I shall behold your face in righteousness; when I awake, I shall be satisfied with your likeness.

3. I will ultimately live for what I love most... so I must make certain that will be God! v. 15

Conclusions:

- -I can live my life in such a way that invites God's blessings
- -That type of life will be "unnatural" and a hard swim upstream
 - -My desire draws my heart, and I choose to desire God!
