


## Dear Humans.... Meet God

A Communion Devotion Psalm 27

### How do we learn what God is like, since we cannot see Him?



On this communion Sunday we look at one of the most popular and beloved Psalms, Psalm 27. It is loved because it is real, raw, and deeply personal. It is one of David's "wisdom" Psalms, about fear and courage, hope and despair... things we all feel. David declares that no matter what life throws at him, he has learned that God is bigger!

- The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?
  - <sup>2</sup> When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh, my adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall.
- <sup>3</sup> Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.

### 1. When we get to know God, it changes everything! (1-3)

#### A. To know God is to learn that He is more than an idea or a religion... He is real and powerful! (God is my light, my salvation, my stronghold)

## B. To trust God is to build an impregnable fortress around your life:

- NO FEAR can penetrate your faith
- No circumstance can destroy your hope
- No adversary can defeat the love God has focused on your life!

31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? <sup>37</sup> No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

38 For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup> nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8, ESV)

- 4 One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple.
- <sup>5</sup> For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will conceal me under the cover of his tent; he will lift me high upon a rock.

6 And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me, and I will offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the Lord. <sup>7</sup> Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud; be gracious to me and answer me! 8 You have said, "Seek my face." My heart says to you, "Your

face, Lord, do I seek."

- <sup>9</sup> Hide not your face from me. Turn not your servant away in anger, O you who have been my help. Cast me not off; forsake me not, O God of my salvation!
- <sup>10</sup> For my father and my mother have forsaken me, but the Lord will take me in.
  - 11 Teach me your way, O Lord, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies.

### 2. When we get to know God, it will change what we desire. (4-12)


- A. We will want to be near Him (to seek his intimacy and offer Him worship)
  - B. We will want to declare Him to others!
  - C. We will want to please Him in our actions.

- <sup>12</sup> Give me not up to the will of my adversaries; for false witnesses have risen against me, and they breathe out violence.
- 13 I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living!
- 14 Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!

# 3. When we get to know God, it will change how we view the future! (13-14)

- I believe!... Therefore I will "Wait"
  - "Be strong"
  - And "Take courage"
