President Elpido Quirino's wife and three of his children were murdered by Japanese soldiers in WWII. Quirino shocked and changed the world when he forgave and released Japanese war criminals in 1953.



Psalm 32 is known for its beauty. It touches our hearts because it is about the power of forgiveness and confession. The ancient song reminds us that God longs to embrace us in His grace and mercy, but He also demands that we humble ourselves and acknowledge our sin. Every great spiritual movement begins with a season of confession from God's people... what if we began that movement today?

- ¹ Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.
 - ² Blessed is the man against whom the Lord counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.
- ³ For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.
- ⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer. *Selah*

1. Forgiveness is possible, powerful and deeply personal... we must learn to receive it... to offer it and to seek it! (1-6)

When you've really experienced true forgiveness, it changes you deep within!

- 1) A new state of being: Blessedsoul happy
- 2) Freedom!

2 Cor. 3:17 -Where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom

Galatians 5:1 -For freedom Christ set us free

Galatians 5:13 -You were called to freedom

1 Peter 2:16 -Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover up for evil.

Random Thoughts on Forgiveness: When we refuse to give or receive forgiveness we voluntarily lock ourselves in a prison of resentment


Forgiveness is the key that unlocks the door of resentment and the handcuffs of hatred. - Corrie ten Boom

Random Thoughts on Forgiveness: Refusing to Forgive is a primary cause of God shutting down His plans to bless you



Random Thoughts on Forgiveness:

powerful way to promote the Gospel

⁵ I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin. Selah

⁶ Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him. ⁷ You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance. Selah

2. The path to real forgiveness with God is confession (5-7)

- I acknowledged my sin- and stopped covering up
 - I confessed to the Lord- and He came thru!
- I responded immediately when God summoned
 - The results have been life-giving!

- ⁸ I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you.
 - ⁹Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you.

- ¹⁰ Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who trusts in the Lord.
 - ¹¹ Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

3. Now that I have been forgiven... what next?

 This is a perfect moment to allow God to teach me big life lessons! (8)

Now is the time to stop being mule-headed (9)

Gratitude! (10-11)

- Every person has the same entry point into a relationship with God... personal confession focused on Jesus Christ.
 - Every Christian has the same path into ongoing intimacy with God... daily confession of sin.
 - If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)
