


Making the Most of my Time on Planet Earth

How Social Isolation is Killing Us



Our incredible song today (Psalm 39) is about value... in particular the value we place on the precious commodity called "time." How can you make the most of the time you are given? How can you avoid wasting your time?

David challenges us to 'seize the moment' with deep *love* for your God and your generation, deep *faith* in God's goodness, and deep *hope* in your amazing future in Christ!

¹ I said, "I will guard my ways, that I may not sin with my tongue; I will guard my mouth with a muzzle, so long as the wicked are in my presence."

² I was mute and silent; I held my peace to no avail, and my distress grew worse. ³ My heart became hot within me. As I mused, the fire burned; then I spoke with my tongue:

⁴ "O Lord, make me know my end and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting I am! ⁵ Behold, you have made my days a few handbreadths, and my lifetime is as nothing before you. Surely all mankind stands as a mere breath! Selah

⁶ Surely a man goes about as a shadow! Surely for nothing they are in turmoil; man heaps up wealth and does not know who will gather! ⁷ "And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you.

⁸ Deliver me from all my transgressions. Do not make me the scorn of the fool! ⁹ I am mute; I do not open my mouth, for it is you who have done it. ¹⁰ Remove your stroke from me; I am spent by the hostility of your hand. ¹¹ When you discipline a man with rebukes for sin, you consume like a moth what is dear to him; surely all mankind is a mere breath! Selah

First... it is tempting to disengage from the world and just "do us," but that does not serve God's purpose for us or the world! (Verses 1-3)

¹⁶ And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. 17 He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' ¹⁸ "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my

surplus grain.

¹⁹ And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry." ²⁰ "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?' ²¹ "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God." (Luke 12, NIV)

What exactly are my obligations to God and my neighbor regarding how I live my life?

Treat others as you want them to treat you. This is what the Law and the Prophets are all about. Matthew 7:12



I will declare your name to my people; in the assembly I will praise you. Psalm 22:22

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. Psalm 51:15

But the Holy Spirit will come upon you and give you power. Then you will tell everyone about me in Jerusalem, in all Judea, in Samaria, and everywhere in the world."

Acts 1:8, CEV

God made you so He could know and love you forever, but that is not the whole story. He also made you so YOU could know and love your generation, and tell them of His love!

Second... I must learn to be urgent about eternal things as I learn to be at peace with mortal matters.

(verses 4-7)

4 Quick ways to waste your life without even trying

- To live like you have nothing, when you really have everything.
 - To live like tomorrow is the show and today is the rehearsal.
 - To live like your life is "your" life.
- To live like you have forever, but forget to secure forever

Third... While I ponder the meaning of my mortal existence, it helps to remember this world and all its stuff is God's and not mine, including me! (verses 7-11)

My hope is in you...

Ways we "give up" w/o realizing it:

 We let go of faith for sight and "right" for the sake of "right now"- this is giving up on God

 We let go of our "soul" for the sake of our physical self. This is a form of giving up on "us."

We turn our neighbor into our competitor.
This is how we give up on each other.

The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever.

(1 John 2:17, NIV)

"Carpe aeternum!"

¹² "Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry; hold not your peace at my tears! For I am a sojourner with you, a guest, like all my fathers. ¹³ Look away from me, that I may smile again, before I depart and am no more!"

Conclusion... I intend to make the most of my fleeting days, and the only way to truly do that is to journey with God today! (verses 12-13)
