

Mighty God!

Isaiah 9:6; Colossians 1:13-20

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

(Isaiah 9:6)

"El-Gibbor"

el= "God" el is the divine predicate (el Shaddai, el ohim, el elyon, etc...)

gibbor= "Mighty one" or "hero"





Isaiah presents to us Jesus, Mighty God arriving in the flesh at Christmas. What irony to think of the one and only "Mighty God" wrapped in peasant rags, born in an animal shelter, laying in a manger. Isaiah tells us 700 years before Jesus' birth that he would be no ordinary child, not just a teacher, prophet, healer or king... but he would be the MIGHTY GOD come to save us from sin and death! Today we examine why that is such good news.











1. Jesus truly lives up to His name... Immanuel, God is with us! (Isaiah 7:14)

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Isaiah 7:14

God with us means we have **light** from a better source

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.

Isaiah 9:2

In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

John 1:4-5

God with us means we have **love**, of a different kind (1 John)

See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are.

1 John 3:1

God with us means we have **life** with no expiration date

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. John 10:10

Application: by telling us that the Mighty God was on the way Isaiah is saying that the Lord of Light, Love, and Life, all wrapped into one person had decided to focus his powerful goodness on humanity, and Christmas is the proof!

2. God is Still With Us Today!

In our sickness and our sorrows...

In our sin and failures...

The Mighty God of heaven has come down to make a difference in your life today. Invite his power to make its home in your heart.

3. God is still Mighty

Colossians 1:13-20

- He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son,
 - ¹⁴ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.
 - ¹⁵ He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation.

- ¹⁶ For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him.
- ¹⁷ And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.
 - ¹⁸ And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent.

¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. **Colossians 1:13-20**

The might of God is not best understood looking at the mountains or the heavens. The might of God is best understood looking at the manger, the cross, and the empty tomb!

Some gifts you can give this Christmas are beyond monetary value: Mend a quarrel, dismiss suspicion, tell someone, "I love you." Give something away. Forgive someone who has treated you wrong. Turn away wrath with a soft answer. Visit someone in a nursing home. Apologize if you were wrong. Be especially kind to someone with whom you work. Give as God gave to you in Christ, without obligation, or announcement, or reservation, or hypocrisy.
